ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Tuckwell Scholarship was founded as a partnership between ANU and philanthropic benefactors, Dr Graham Tuckwell AO and Dr Louise Tuckwell AO. The first Tuckwell Scholars arrived at ANU in early 2014.

Through a committed team of academic, professional staff, and Scholar volunteers, the Tuckwell Scholarship Program (the Program) aims to:

• Build community, connections, and friendship within Scholar year cohorts, between cohorts, and within areas of common interest

• Create a safe and welcoming environment for Scholars at Scholars House, and provide study spaces and opportunities for gathering as a community



• Facilitate discussion about making contributions to local and campus communities, to Australia, and beyond

- Encourage multi-disciplinary thinking through strong interaction and collaboration amongst a diverse and inclusive group of Scholars and Alumni
- Highlight and encourage the benefits of undergraduate residential experience
- Create and support a community of Alumni who can become leaders in their various fields of endeavours and who wish to help build similar opportunities for others

The Scholars House team, together with Tuckwell Scholars and with colleagues from across the ANU, will be actively working towards the goals set out in this Strategic Plan in coming years.



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1. Delivery informed by best practice

Develop and execute a contemporary, future focused program of support and development for Scholars. The Program will place Scholars at the centre of our Vision and Purpose, and work collaboratively with other areas of ANU to maximise Scholar's experience at each stage of their journey, from application through to Alumni. 2. Leading for learning

Take the lead in empowering and enabling our Scholars to cultivate connections within their cohort, across Tuckwell cohorts and with Tuckwell Alumni. We build strong relationships to enable Scholars to feel safe to take on difficult challenges, learn from success and failure, and help others.

- seeking Scholar participation to create a thriving co-curricular program encompassing leadership, social and life skills, professional connections and mentoring for the enrichment of Scholars which draws on resources and expertise from across ANU, as well as in-house bespoke programming suited to the different stages of Scholars' life.
- exploring and learning good practices from other scholarships, and engaging with our community, to deliver a Scholar experience equal to the world's best.
- providing clear and consistent expectations of participation in Scholars House events and activities to foster a strong community network and enable greater impact.
- clarifying and communicating the Fellows' role to ensure Scholars are appropriately supported in their academic, personal and professional development.

- demonstrating our alignment with ANU through participation in University networks and communities of practice, prize nominations and our communication strategy.
- proactively curating opportunities for Scholars to engage with ANU offerings (such as Global Programs, Med Pathway and internships), and build their leadership, collaboration and networking skills and capacities, as well as opportunities for Alumni to remain engaged with the Program and ANU.
- establishing and maintaining traditions and cultural symbols important to Scholars and Alumni.
